20	authority over communications and utilities to establish Navajo Nation policy
21	with respect to optimum utilization of all Navajo Nation resources. 2 N.N.C. §

23	B. The Navajo Nation Council established the Law and Order Committee as a
24	Navajo Nation standing committee and was delegated authority to review and
25	make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed amendments
26	to and enactments to the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. §§ 600(C) and
27	601(B)(14).
28	C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'iyáti' Committee as a Navajo
29	Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final

3	D. The Navajo Nation Council must review and approve enactments or amendments

7	A. The Navajo Nation Telecommunication Regulatory Commission ("NNTRC")
8	was established to regulate telecommunications within the Navajo Nation and
9	delegated the power to perform any and all acts necessary and convenient to
10	supervise, monitor, and regulate telecommunication and those persons providing
11	telecommunications service within the Navajo Nation. 21 N.N.C. §§ 504 and 505
12	(A).
13	B. In order for the NNTRC to effectively carry out its duties, Title 21 must be
14	amended.

association, government (other than the government of the Navajo Nation and any wholly owned subdivision or enterprise of that government), public or private organization, and any part, division or agency of any of the foregoing or any other entity.

Section Four. Effective Date

* * *

The Act enacted herein shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221.

Section Five. Codification

The provisions of this ordinance which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

Section Six. Saving Clause

Should any provisions of this ordinance be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions of this ordinance which are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.
