#### WHEREAS:

 Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §164 (A)(16) "[m]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council."

2. The Navajo Nation offers this supporting resolution to support all aspects of providing emergency relief services including, preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery.

3. Senator Tom Udall (D-NM) introduced in the U.S. Senate a bill entitled, "Tribal Public Health Security and Preparedness Bill." See attached Exhibit A. The purpose of the bill is to ensure that Indian Tribes have direct access to Public Health Security and Preparedness funds. Under existing law, tribes are not eligible for such funds.
