
PURPOSE: Approving a Revocable Use Permit for Navajo Engineering and Construction Authority (NECA) for a temporary hot plant site and construction yard during reconstruction of BIA./Navajo Route N27 in the vicinity of Chinle, Chapter, Navajo Nation (Apache County, Arizona).

18 **Section One. Findings**

- 19 A. Pursuant to 2 NNC §501 (B)(2), the Resources and Development Committee of the
20 Navajo Nation Council has authority to give final approval of all land withdrawals,
21 non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding
22 requirements on Navajo Nation land and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall
23 include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers,
24 renewals, and terminations.
- 25 B. The Navajo Engineering and Construction Authority Post Office Box 969, Shiprock,
26 New Mexico 87420, submitted a request for a Revocable Use Permit for a
27 temporary hot plant site and construction yard during reconstruction of BIA/Navajo
28 Route N27 in the vicinity of Chinle Chapter, Navajo Nation (Apache County,
29 Arizona), attached hereto and made part of as **Exhibit A**.

- 1 C. The proposed Revocable Use Permit will consist of 15 acres, more or less, and two
2 entrances within the right-of-way, approximately 6.65 miles south of Chinle along
3 BIA/Navajo Route N27. The location is more particularly described on the survey
4 map attached hereto and made part hereof as **Exhibit B**.
- 5 D. The General Land Department has obtained the document Consent to Use Navajo
6 Tribal Lands, attached as **Exhibit C**, from the Grazing Permit
- 7 E. The environmental and archaeological clearances have been completed and are
8 attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. See **Exhibit E**, Appendix
9 to Revocable Use permit for NECA's Temporary Hot Plant Site and Construction
10 Yard.

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12 **Section Two. Approval**

- 13 A. Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby
14 approves a Revocable Use Permit for Navajo Engineering and Construction
15 Authority for a temporary hot plant site and construction yard during reconstruction
16 of BIA/Navajo Route N27 on 15 acres, more or less, and two entrances within the
17 right-of-way, of Navajo Nation Trust Lands in the vicinity of Chinle Chapter,
18 Navajo Nation (Apache County, Arizona). The location is more particularly
19 described on the map marked as **Exhibit B**.
- 20 B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby
21 approves the Revocable Use Permit subject to but not limited to, the Terms and
22 Conditions attached hereto as **Exhibit D**.
- 23 C. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby
24 authorizes the President of the Navajo Nation to execute any and all documents
25 necessary to implement the intent and purpose of this resolution.
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
