18	1. There exists a crisis in the United States concerning missing indigenous women and	
19	girls. In 2016, the Urban Indian Health Institute found that of the 5716 such missing	
20	cases, only 117 cases were inputted in the database maintained by the United States	
21	Department of Justice. See, "Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, a	
22	report issued by the Urban Indian Health Institute, http://www.uihi.org. It is also	
23	reported, "generations of killings and disappearances have been disregarded by law	
24	enforcement and lost in bureaucratic gaps concerning which local or federal agencies

27	2. The legislature of the state of Utah has introduced a bill to create a task force on	
28	"Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls." See Exhibit A. The Task Force	
29	would consult with tribal and federal governments on issues regarding missing and

murdered indigenous women and girls, including developing procedures for addressing new and unsolved cases.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

The Navajo Nation hereby supports the legislature of the state of Utah in its proposed bill to create a task force on "Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls," House Bill 116.
