27	Section Two. Establishing 638 Negotiating Team	
28	The Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby establishes a	
29	negotiating team for all proposed or anticipated Navajo Nation P.L. 93-638 contracts.

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The negotiating team shall consist of five (5) members, representing the Navajo Nation Office of the President/Vice President, the Office of the Speaker, the Office of the Controller, the Attorney General and the program seeking federal funds under contract. Upon recommendation of the entities named herein, the Naabik'íyáti' Committee shall confirmed the appointments.

Section Three. Duties and Responsibilities

The duties and responsibilities of the Negotiating Team shall be as follows:

1. The entity shall only exist for the duration of the 24th Navajo Nation Council.

2. The Negotiating Team shall meet periodically, upon duly-called meetings.

3. The Negotiating Team shall not delay contract reviews and the approval process under Navajo law. The authority of the Negotiating Team shall be limited to providing recommendations and serving as an advisory role to Navajo Nation officials responsible for 638 contracting.

4. Notwithstanding the establishment of the Negotiating Team herein, the Navajo Nation's procedural requirements of Title 2 for federal contracts shall remain the same.

5. Except for necessary expenses and subject to available program funds, members attending meetings shall not be compensated.
