18 Section One. Authority

19 A. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council
20 with authority to "review and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on
21 proposed amendments to and enactments in the Navajo Nation Code." 2 N.N.C.
22 §601(B)(14).

23 B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council is a standing committee of
24 the Navajo Nation Council. All proposed resolutions requiring final action by the Navajo
25 Nation Council must be "assigned to standing committee(s) having authority over the
26 subject matter at issue and the Naabik'iyáti' Committee." 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).

27 C. The Navajo Nation Council is the lawmaking body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §
28 102.

1 **Section Two. Findings**

2 A. Navajo Nation Council Delegates are elected by voters of the Navajo Nation.

3 B. Under Navajo Nation law, a delegate is not allowed to be employed by or serve as an
4 elected official of federal or state government. A delegate also cannot be employed by the
5 Navajo Nation or serve as an elected official in another elective position thereof. 2 N.N.C.
6 § 104(A) and (B) and 11 N.N.C. §§ 8(B)(7), (9) and (11).

7 C. Under the Navajo Election Code, loyalty to the Navajo Nation is a requirement for
8 Navajo Nation Council Delegates. See also, *In Re Wagner*, 6 Nav. R. 114 (2007).

9 D. Concerning elective offices, it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation that delegates
10 serve in no other elective position in any government.

12 **Section Three. Amending Title 2**

13 Title 2 of the Navajo Nation Code is amended as follows:

20 **§ 104. Incompatible Service**

21 A. No person shall serve as a delegate if he or she is in the permanent
22 employment or is serving in any elective position of the ~~United States or any state~~
23 ~~or subdivisions thereof~~ any government, including the United States, tribal, state,
24 county or city government. ~~;~~ ~~nor shall an elected official of the United States or~~
25 ~~the several states thereof serve as a delegate.~~ This Section shall not apply to
26 service on a school board or elective county office.

27 B. ~~No person shall be eligible for election to the Navajo Nation Council if that~~
28 ~~person is permanently employed or an elected official as described in §104(A).~~

29 C. B. If any delegate, after his/her election, enters such service, the delegate
30 shall immediately forfeit his/her office as a Council Delegate.

1 D. C. No Council Delegate shall engage in the private practice of law while
2 serving as a Navajo Nation Council Delegate.

6 Title 11 of the Navajo Nation Code is amended as follows:

12 B. Qualifications for Delegate to the Navajo Nation Council:

14 ~~7.—Candidates elected, who are employed by the Navajo Nation, must resign~~
15 ~~from such employment before taking the oath of office and shall not be~~
16 ~~employed by the Navajo Nation during their term of office;~~

17 ****

18 ~~9.—Must not, if elected, serve in any other elected Navajo Nation Office with~~
19 ~~the exception of the office(s) of the school board(s).~~

20 ****

21 ~~49.~~ Must not be in the permanent employment or serve in any elective
22 position of the United States or any state or subdivisions thereof any
23 government, including the United States, tribal, state, county or city
24 government, ; nor shall an elected official of the United States or the several
25 states thereof serve as a delegate. This Section shall not apply to service on a
26 school board or elective county office. Candidates employed in or holding
27 such positions shall resign prior to taking oaths of office for delegate positions
28 if elected.

Section Five. Vote required

As amendments hereof include portions of Title 2, a two-thirds (2/3rd) vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council is required for this action. CD-68-89 (resolved 6).

Section Six. Effective date

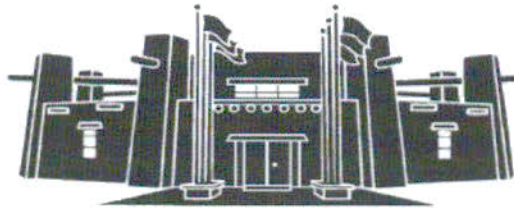
The amendment enacted herein shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C §221.

Section Seven. Codification

The amendments of the Navajo Nation Code enacted herein shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall include the amendments in the next recodification or supplement of the Navajo Nation Code, to the extent practicable. All affected sections shall be properly redesignated where appropriate.

Section Eight. Savings Clause

Should any portion of the amendments enacted herein be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.
