**TITLE OF RESOLUTION:** AN ACT RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING 2 N.N.C. §§1002(D) AND 1003(C) AND 11 N.N.C. § 8(A) TO CLARIFY THAT TERM LIMITS FOR NAVAJO NATION OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT ARE NO MORE THAN TWO TERMS IN A LIFETIME

**PURPOSE:** This resolution will amend 2 N.N.C. §§1002(D) and 1003(C) and 11 N.N.C. § 8(A) to provide clarification to existing statutory language as to term limits (two terms only) for Navajo Nation Office of the President and Vice President elective positions. The clarification is to restrict or otherwise prohibit an individual from serving more than two terms as President or two terms as Vice President in a lifetime.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. Under the Navajo Election Code, a term of office is four years. 11 N.N.C. § 6(A). For the offices of the President, Vice-President and Council Delegate, the code states and defines the beginning and ending dates of this four-year term as follows - "At each general election all persons elected to the offices of President of the Navajo Nation, Vice-President of the Navajo Nation and Delegate of the Navajo Nation Council shall be installed in office at noon on the second Tuesday after the first Monday of January following their election and their predecessors' term of office shall expire upon their installation in office." 11 N.N.C. § 6(B). Terms start upon oaths administered in January after each general election and end four calendar years thereafter. Terms do extend beyond this defined period.

B. The Navajo Election Code provides, "[e]xcept as otherwise provided by law, the number of terms a person may hold a Navajo elective office shall be unlimited." 11 N.N.C. § 7(A).

C. Title 2 of the Navajo Nation Code provides term limits for the Navajo Nation Office of the President and the Vice President. For the Office of the President, the law provides - "The President shall serve no more than two terms" 2 N.N.C. § 1002(D). Similarly, with respect to the Office of the Vice President, the law provides - "The Vice-President shall serve no more than two terms" 1003(C).

D. The Navajo Supreme Court determined that the two-term limit set forth at 2 N.N.C. § 1002(D) for the Office of the President as valid. See *Todacheene v. Shirley*, 9 Nav. R. 380 (Nav. Sup. Ct. August 2, 2010). The court however construed the two-term restriction of 2 N.N.C. §1002(D) to mean two consecutive terms (eight years) for a sitting President. Thereafter, an individual completing consecutive terms as President must sit out a full term before seeking additional terms. In this respect, the court stated, "2 N.N.C. §1002(D) imposes a space of one term between a former two-term President's candidacy for that same office." *Todacheene v. Shirley*, 9 Nav.R. 380, 384 (Nav. Sup. Ct. August 2, 2010).

#### SECTION THREE. AMENDING 2 N.N.C. §§1002(D) AND 1003(C)

The Navajo Nation hereby reaffirms the statutorily-enacted two-term limit for the Offices of the Navajo President and Vice-President. However, the two-term limit provisions at 2 N.N.C. §§1002(D) and 1003(C) are amended for clarification purposes as follows:

## SECTION FIVE. VOTE REQUIRED

Pursuant to CD-68-89, this action requires a two-thirds (2/3rds) vote of the full Navajo Nation Council.

# SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE; RETROACTIVE APPLICATION

These amendments shall operate retroactively upon their approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221. They shall apply to all individuals who have served two terms, consecutive or not, as Navajo Nation President or two terms as Vice President.

### SECTION SEVEN. CODIFICATION

These amendments shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel in the next recodification or supplement of the Navajo Nation Code to the extent practicable.

### SECTION EIGHT. SAVINGS CLAUSE

Should any provision of these amendments be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the amendments, or any portion thereof, which are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.
