TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO THE LAW AND ORDER COMMITTEE, HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL: ADOPTING THE "ACCESIBLE PUBLIC RESTROOMS ACT"; ESTABLISHING THE REQUIEMENT FOR ALL NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC SERVICE PROVIDERS TO PROVIDE CLEARLY INDICATED ACCESSIBLE PUBLIC RESTROOMS; AMENDING THE NAVAJO NATION CODE, TITLE 13, CHAPTER 53; ADDING NEW SECTIONS 4501, 4502, 4503, and 4504

PURPOSE: If approved, this resolution will establish the requirement for all Navajo Nation Government and public service provider buildings to provide clearly indicated accessible public restrooms to the general public. This resolution will further amend the Navajo Nation Code Title 13. Chapter 53, adding new sections 4501, 4502, 4503, and 4504

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

20	BE IT ENACTED:
21	Section One. Authority
22	A. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation
23	Council and is empowered with the authority to review and make
24	recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on amendments to and
25	enactments in the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. § 601(B)(14).
26	B. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation
27	Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 401(B)(6), has the power to provide
28	legislative oversight on matters involving health, social service, education,
29	general governmental services, and human services.

1	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2
2	N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), reviews proposed legislation which requires final action
3	by the Navajo Nation Council.
4	D. The Navajo Nation Council must review and approve enactments or
5	amendments of positive law. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A).
6	
7	Section Two. Findings
8	A. The Navajo Nation Government maintains offices throughout Navajo Nation
9	providing services to community members.
10	B. Public Service Providers also maintain offices throughout Navajo Nation
11	providing services to Navajo Nation community members.
12	C. A Public Service Provider is a non-governmental entity that delivers services
13	essential to the public interest such as electricity, gas, or transportation.
14	D. The Navajo Nation community consists of many citizens who are disabled
15	including elders, adults, young adults, and children.
16	E. Navajo Nation community members conduct their personal business and
17	acquire necessary resources from the various governmental and public service
18	provider offices from the Navajo Nation Departments, Programs, Offices, and
19	other important entities.
20	F. Navajo Nation community members, including disabled elders, adults, young
21	adults, and children, may need to use the restroom facilities while conducting
22	personal business from Navajo Nation Government and public service
23	provider buildings.
24	G. It is within the best interest of the Navajo Nation to adopt the "Accessible
25	Public Restrooms Act" and amend Title 13, establishing Subchapter 53 and
26	sections 4501, 4502, 4503, and 4504 of the Navajo Nation Code to require
27	that all Navajo Nation Government and public service provider buildings that
28	provide direct services to the Navajo Nation community provide clearly
29	indicated accessible public restrooms for the general public.

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2	Section Three. Amendment to Title 13
3	The Navajo Nation amends Title 13 as follows:
4	
5	TITLE 13. HEALTH AND WELFARE
6	SUBCHAPTER 53. Accessible Public Restrooms
7	***
8	<u>§ 4501. Title</u>
9	A. This Act shall be known and cited as the "Accessible Public Restrooms Act"
10	
11	<u>§ 4502. Purpose</u>
12	The Navajo Nation declares that it is in the best interest of the Diné that the Navajo
13	Nation shall provide clearly indicated accessible public restrooms in all governmental
14	and public service provider buildings that provide direct services to the Navajo Nation
15	community to serve the disabled elderly, adult, young adult, and children of the
16	community.
17	
18	<u>§ 4503. Definitions</u>
19	Public Service Provider is a non-governmental entity that delivers services essential
20	to the public interest such as electricity, gas, or transportation.
21	
22	§ 4504. Accessible Public Bathroom
23	A. The Navajo Nation shall provide accessible public restrooms in all governmental
24	buildings that provide direct services to the Navajo Nation community.
25	B. The Navajo Nation, through its Department of Health, shall ensure that all
26	governmental buildings and public service provider buildings that provide direct
27	services to the Navajo Nation community provide accessible public restrooms and
28	provide clear indication of the location of these public restrooms.
29	
30	Section Four. Approval and Acceptance of Amendments to 13 N.N.C §§ 4501,

4502, 4503, and 4504

The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Amendments to 13 N.N.C. §§ 4501, 4502, 4503, and 4504.

Section Four. Directive

Therefore Navajo Nation hereby directs all Navajo Nation Government offices and public service provider offices that provide direct services to the Navajo Nation community to provide clearly indicated accessible public restrooms no later than one year from the date this act is adopted and signed into law. All Navajo Nation Government offices and public service provider offices shall take the necessary steps to comply with this act and shall inform the Department of Health quarterly of their progress towards full compliance.

Section Five. Effective Date

The Navajo Nation Code amendment enacted herein shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

Section Six. Codification

The provisions of this Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

Section Seven. Saving Clause

Should any provisions of this ordinance be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation
Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the
Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions of this ordinance which are not
determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.
