



# Navajo Nation Council 2021 winter regular session to commence January 25

### FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: January 22, 2021

**WINDOW ROCK, Ariz.** – In accordance with Title II of the Navajo Nation Code, the winter regular session of the Navajo Nation Council will commence Monday, Jan. 25, at 10 a.m. (MT).

The session is authorized to continue through the end of business Friday.

The session will take place at the Navajo Nation Council Chamber in Window Rock in hybrid format with Council delegates attending in-person within the chamber or immediately outside the chamber in their respective vehicles.

Discussion will be facilitated through teleconferencing methods.

The session will begin immediately with the election of the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council in coordination with the Navajo Election Administration (NEA).

The election is required by the Code at the start of the winter regular session in every oddnumbered year.

The first day of the agenda will also include the state of the Navajo Nation address from the Navajo Nation President, the Navajo Nation Judicial Branch report by the Chief Justice of the Navajo Nation and the Speaker's Report.

Oral and written reports will be delivered to the Council from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Indian Health Service (IHS) and select Navajo Nation enterprises and programs, as required by the Navajo Nation Code.

The Council will take action on legislation relating to regular policy and appropriation matters of the Navajo Nation. Generally, the proposed agenda is subject to change through the review and adoption process at the start of the session.

Legislation pertaining to the ongoing Covid-19 (coronavirus) response may be addressed during the regular session.

## Safety

Access to the chamber will be facilitated by the Navajo Nation Legislative Branch employee exposure safety plan, which was developed in partnership with the Navajo Nation Occupational Safety and Health Administration (NNOSHA). All Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines will be followed, including mandatory mouth and nose coverings and social distancing.

All participants of the session in the chamber underwent mandatory rapid testing for Covid-19 on Friday as part of the required safety screening process.

Access to the chamber will not be allowed under the facility safety plan without negative results. Additionally, body temperature checks and a screen questionnaire will be required for the safety of all participants.

### Agenda and livestream

The proposed agenda has been posted to the Navajo Nation Council website. The approved agenda will be posted immediately following Council's vote to accept it on Monday.
