PURPOSE: To confirm the appointment of Mr. James Benally to the Commission On Navajo Government Development, as the Northern Navajo Agency Council Representative, to serve a term of four (4) years.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

17	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
18	A. The Naabik'iyati' Committee has legislative oversight authority over the Commission	
19	on Navajo Government Development and the Office of Navajo Government	
20	Development. 2 N.N.C. § 970.	
21	B. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'iyati' Committee as a Navajo Nation	
22	Council standing committee and as such empowered Naabik'iyati' Committee to	
23	recommend all resolutions to the Navajo Nation Council on matters within the	
24	Committee's jurisdiction pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 701 (A)(3).	
25	C. The Navajo Nation Council confirms appointments to the Commission on Navajo	
26	Government Development. 2 N.N.C. § 972 (A)(5).	
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28	SECTION TWO. FINDINGS	
29	A. The Commission on Navajo Government Development is a special entity created by	
30	the Navajo Nation Council with quasi-independent authority to accomplish the	

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People's project of instituting reforms necessary to ensure an accountable and responsible government. 2 N.N.C. § 970.

- B. The Commission consists of twelve (12) members confirmed by and serving at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 972 (A).
- C. Five (5) members shall be nominated from the five (5) agencies of the Navajo Nation. Each agency council shall nominate one (1) member from recommendations to be submitted by chapters in each agency, said nominee shall be either Chapter officers, local Government/Governance Commissioners, Grazing Committee/Land Board members, or School Board members. These members shall serve a term of four (4) years from the date of confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 972 (A)(5).
- D. Commission members shall be chosen from among individuals who have demonstrated scholarship, a strong sense of civic interest, knowledge of Dine' history and cultural heritage, spiritual leadership, leadership in the Navajo government and abilities likely to contribute to the fulfillment of the duties of the commission. 2 N.N.C. § 972 (D).
- E. Mr. James Benally has been nominated and recommended to the appointment, by Northern Navajo Agency Council Resolution NNAC-102-2021, Exhibit A, to fill the Northern Navajo Agency Council Representative position. Mr. Benally's letter of interest and resume are attached as Exhibit B.
- SECTION THREE. CONFIRMATION

The Navajo Nation Council hereby confirms the appointment of Mr. James Benally as the Northern Navajo Agency Council Representative, to the Commission on Navajo Government Development, for a term of four (4) years from the date of confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council.

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
