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18	BE IT ENACTED:	
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20	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
21	A. The Health, Education, and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of the	
22	Navajo Nation Council with the authority to review and recommend legislation relating to	
23	the Navajo Nation Division of Social Services. 2 N.N.C. §454(B)(8).	
24	B. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council	
25	that is empowered to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting,	
26	appropriation, investment, and management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §301(B)(2).	
27	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council that is	
28	responsible for reviewing proposed resolutions that require final action by the Navajo	
29	Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9).	
30	D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A).	

- E. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. "The Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at §820(J)." 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
- F. The restrictions on supplemental appropriations include:
  - 1. Supplemental appropriations from non-recurring revenues shall be approved only for non-recurring expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(F). The Controller designates which revenues are recurring and which are non-recurring. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
  - The Navajo Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance costs, from recurring revenues only. Long-term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820(E).
  - 3. The Navajo Nation Code further provides, ". . . non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. §820(F).
  - 4. All requests for supplemental funding shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. §820(M).

## SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. The coronavirus pandemic of 2019 has caused large scale infections and loss of life throughout the world, the United States, and the Navajo Nation. As of November 1, 2021, the Navajo Nation Health Command Operations Center has confirmed 36,867 COVID-19 cases and 1,487 COVID-related deaths on the Navajo Nation. COVID-19 variants have recently emerged that threaten to increase these numbers and continue the pandemic's assault on the Navajo People.

- B. Under its COVID-19 Burial Assistance Program, the Navajo Nation Division of Social Services ("NNDSS") continues to receive requests for financial assistance to help families with funeral costs for Navajo Nation members who have passed away from COVID-19 causes and who resided on and off the Navajo Reservation.
- C. On March 26, 2021, by Resolution CMA-14-21, the Navajo Nation Council appropriated supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$2,002,000 to the NNDSS for COVID-19-related burial assistance. However, these funds lapsed on September 30, 2021, thereby leaving 30 assistance requests with NNDSS that are unfunded and currently pending.
- D. The NNDSS has prepared a Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary, dated November 17, 2021. NNDSS is seeking \$2,046,781 from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to cover COVID-19-related burial assistance for Navajo decedents who resided on and off the Navajo Reservation, and to pay for NNDSS' operating and overtime expenses. **EXHIBIT A.** NNDSS' Budget Forms 1, 2, and 4 are also included. **EXHIBIT B.**
- E. The memorandum from the Office of the Controller will be provided when this legislation is being considered, in compliance with 12 N.N.C. §820(L).
- F. The memorandum from the Office of Management and Budget will be provided when the legislation is being considered, in compliance with 12 N.N.C. §820(M).

## SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$2,046,781 IN UUFB SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FOR THE NNDSS FOR COVID-19-RELATED BURIAL ASSISTANCE

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves \$2,046,781 in supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Navajo Nation Division of Social Services for COVID-19-related burial assistance for Navajo decedents who resided on and off the Navajo Reservation, and to fund NNDSS' related operating and overtime expenses.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$2,046,781 shall be from the amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller.
- C. This supplemental appropriation of \$2,046,781 shall be available until fully expended and shall not lapse on September 30, 2022.

1	SECTION FOUR. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F), AND §820(J)
2	The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F) and §820(J) to allow
3	funds out of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to be used for recurring
4	expenditures.
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6	SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE
7	This legislation shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. §221(B) and 2 N.N.C.
8	§164(A)(17).
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10	SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE
11	If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Supreme Court of the Navajo
12	Nation, or by the Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme
13	Court, the remainder of this legislation shall remain valid as the law of the Navajo Nation.
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
