Navajo Capacity Building:

- (1) Wastewater/environmental monitoring is a highly accurate way to provide ongoing monitoring* for COVID-19, with the potential to sequence to identify new variants at the neighborhood level, especially in communities where there are social or structural barriers to access diagnostic testing
- (2) Ongoing school support and community engagement is necessary for successful implementation. Principals and teachers need to feel supported when presenting the project to families, district leadership needs to be brought on board as champions to promote the program.
- (3) Wastewater monitoring in schools can serve as a leading indicator of potential outbreaks in specific neighborhoods, allowing for tailored outreach and targeted use of finite resources.
