TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, LAW AND ORDER, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING THE SELECTION PROCESS FOR THE NAVAJO NATION VETERANS ADMINISTRATION EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; AND AMENDING 2 N.N.C. §§ 1031, 1032, 1033, 1034, 1035, 1036 RELATING TO THE NAVAJO NATION VETERANS ADVISORY COUNCIL

PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will amend the selection process of the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director. (NOTE: amendments at 2 N.N.C. §§ 1031(B) and 1034(E)(1) pertains to selection process of the NNVA Executive Director and shall take effect with the new appointment of a NNVA Executive Director after the six-year term of the current Executive Director's contract has expired or the current Executive Director is otherwise no longer contracted as Executive Director, whichever event transpires first). This legislation further amends the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council to become the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners with additional authority. This legislation also clarifies the responsibility and authority for the Executive Director to the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners. Lastly, this legislation provides amendments to the structure and terms limits for the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

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- D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- E. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 1036, amendments made to the Navajo Nation Veterans Act require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Navajo Nation Council upon the recommendation from the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The purpose of this legislation is to change the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council to become the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners with the following authority:
 - 1. To recommend appointment of the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director to the Navajo Nation Council for confirmation after the President of the Navajo Nation selects an Executive Director as a nominee. To recommend termination of the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee and the Navajo Nation Council with notice given to the Navajo Nation President.
 - To recommend to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee to approve the rules, policies and procedures for the Board of Commissioners and the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration in accordance with the laws of the Navajo Nation.
 - To recommend to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee and the Navajo Nation Council for any modification to legislation, or address any concerns relating to veterans and veterans affairs with notice provided to the Navajo Nation President.
 - 4. To review and make recommendations for funding and budget matters of the Board of Commissioners and the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration.
- B. Navajo Nation statutory law currently states that the "President of the Navajo Nation, after consultation with Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council, shall retain by contract for a term of six (6) years an Executive Director who shall head the Veterans Administration." 2 N.N.C. § 1031 (A). This legislation amends 2 N.N.C. § 1031(A) to

- allow the President of the Navajo Nation to recommend a qualified Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director to the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners who will then recommend the appointment of an Executive Director to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee and Navajo Nation Council for confirmation.
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJA-3-16 established the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration and the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council. Within the stated purposes for passing Resolution No. CJA-3-16, the Navajo Nation recognized continued respect and honor for our Navajo veterans through the historic time from Naayéé'neizghání and Tóbájíshchíní, to the Navajo Code Talkers using our language in World War II, and current veterans who recently served in the U.S. Armed Forces. Along with respect and high honor, Navajo veterans are in a unique situation and serve understanding our language and culture and share unique experiences. The Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director shall be an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation.
- D. The Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners is the appropriate governmental entity to recommend an Executive Director for the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration since, as veterans themselves, the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners fully understand the needs and advocates on behalf of all Navajo Nation veterans, qualified surviving spouses, and Gold Star family members with quality, transparent and consistent service. See Resolution No. HEHSCJY-04-16.
- E. This legislation also amends the selection process for the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners with Commissioners to be confirmed by the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. On the other hand, the exofficio shall be selected either from the Blue Star or Gold Star family and be confirmed by the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners.
- F. This legislation further amends the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners to hold bi-monthly meetings which will allow the veterans to meet frequently and address matters promptly.

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- G. This legislation also incorporates a two-year term limit for a Veteran Board of Commissioner and the ex-officio to serve on the Commission. Selection to the Veteran Board of Commissioners is also amended to allow other veterans from their respective Agency Veteran Organization to serve as a Veteran Board of Commissioner.
- H. Lastly, the duty and responsibility of the Executive Director to the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioner is amended and clarified at 2 N.N.C. § 1032(A)(7).
- G. It is in the best interest of Navajo Nation veterans to amend 2 N.N.C. § 1031(A) to select 2 N.N.C. §§ 1031, 1032, 1033, 1034, 1035, 1036 relating to the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council.

SECTION THREE. AMENDMENTS TO 2 N.N.C. §§ 1031, 1032, 1033, 1034, 1035, AND 1036

The Navajo Nation hereby amends the Navajo Nation Code, Title 2 as follows:

Title 2. Navajo Nation Government Chapter 5. Executive Branch Subchapter 1. Generally

Article 3. Navajo Nation Veterans Administration

§ 1031. Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Establishment

- A. The Navajo Nation Veterans Administration is established under the Office of the President and Vice-President of the Navajo Nation. The President of the Navajo Nation, after consultation with the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council, shall retain by contract for a term of six (6) years an Executive Director who shall head the Veterans Administration.
- B. Executive Director:
 - 1. The Navajo Nation Veterans Administration shall be headed by an Executive Director who shall serve at the pleasure of the Navajo Nation Council.

- 2. The Executive Director shall be an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation and honorably discharged from the U.S. Armed Forces.
- 3. The Navajo Nation President shall recommend the Executive Director to the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners at a negotiated salary during such President's administration.
- 4. The Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners shall indicate through resolution its support to the Navajo Nation President's nominee and forward the nominee to the Health Education and Human Services Committee and the Navajo Nation Council for confirmation. If the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners does not support the nominee, then, the Navajo Nation President shall nominate another nominee.
- 5. The appointment shall be effective upon confirmation by the Navajo Nation Council.
- B.C. The Navajo Nation Veterans Administration shall perform its assigned functions as identified in its approved Plan of Operation.

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§ 1032. Responsibility and Authority

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A. In carrying out its responsibilities and Administration, through the Executive Director, is authorized to:

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7. Provide administrative support, and technical assistance, meeting spaces, access to Navajo Nation Veteran facilities, and serve as an advisor to the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council Board of Commissioners.

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§ 1033. Navajo Housing Program

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C. Duties and Responsibilities of the Navajo Veterans Housing Program shall include administering the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Housing Program Policies and

Procedures. The Veterans Administration Housing Program Policies and Procedures shall be approved by the Health, Education and Human Services Committee, upon the recommendation of the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council Board of Commissioners.

Article Four. Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners Advisory Council

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§ 1034. Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners Advisory Council **Establishment**

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The Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners Advisory Council is established A. under the Executive Branch of the Navajo Nation government.

The purpose and authority of the Veterans Board of Commissioners Advisory Council is B. to provide policy advice to the President of the Navajo Nation recommend and advise any changes relating to funding, veterans housing, Navajo Nation Veterans Administration, policies, regulations, and other concerns relating to veterans to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council and the Navaio Nation President, regarding veteran issues and concerns.

Membership; selection; Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson; terms of office; ex-officio C.

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A Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council Board of Commissioners is established consisting of eleven ten (104) members and one (1) ex-officio member.

The Advisory Council Board of Commissioners shall consist of the ten (10) Agency Veteran Commanders or a Veteran selected by their respective Agency Veterans Organization through resolution. The Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners shall consist of ten (10) members, one (1) female and one (1) male selected by each Agency, as the designated voting members with the Administration Executive Director acting as a non-voting member. All Commissioners shall be confirmed by the Health, Education and Human Services

Committee.

All ten (10) as the Commissioners shall be voting members.

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4. Ex-officio member is a non-voting member and shall be selected either from the Blue Star Family or Gold Star Family. The ex-officio member shall be selected

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- and/or removed by the Board of Commissioners through resolution with a majority vote of a full-quorum.
- 3. 5. The Advisory Council Board of Commissioners shall select from its voting members a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson.
- 6. Commissioners and the ex-officio member shall serve a two-year term.
 Commissioners and the ex-officio member shall serve until their successors are appointed.
- 4. Designated members shall be Veterans selected and/or removed by the respective Chapter Veteran Organizations.
- 5. 7. The Council Commissioners and the ex-officio member shall meet on a quarterly bi-monthly basis and as necessary. Commissioners and the ex-officio shall receive a meeting stipend, and travel expense reimbursement pursuant to Navajo Nation laws, policies and procedures and budget.
- 8. The Board of Commissioners shall have a recurring budget for meeting stipends, travel expense reimbursement, and administrative support for all meetings.
- D. The Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director shall provide administrative support, technical assistance, meeting spaces, access to Navajo Nation Veteran facilities, and serve as an advisor to the Navajo Nation Veterans Board of Commissioners.

E. Authority of the Board of Commissioners

- 1. To recommend appointment of the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration

 Executive Director to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee and the Navajo Nation Council for confirmation after the Navajo Nation President nominates an Executive Director. To recommend termination of the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee and the Navajo Nation Council with notice given to the Navajo Nation President.
- To recommend to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee to approve the rules, policies, and procedures for the Board of Commissioners and the

- Navajo Nation Veterans Administration in accordance with the laws of the Navajo Nation.
- 3. To recommend to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee and the Navajo Nation Council for any modification to legislation, or address any concerns relating to veterans and veterans services with notice provided to the Navajo Nation President.
- 4. To review and make recommendations for funding and budget matters of the Board of Commissioners and the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration.

§ 1035. Oversight

The Navajo Nation authorizes the establishment of the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration, the Navajo Nation Veterans Housing Program, and the Navajo Nation Veterans Advisory Council Board of Commissioners. Legislative oversight shall be provided by the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, which will have final approval of the respective plans of operation.

§ 1036. Amendments

These Article may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation from the Navajo Nation Veterans Boards of Commissioners Advisory Council.

SECTION FOUR. DIRECTIVE TO AMEND PLANS OF OPERATION

Divisions, departments, programs, and organizations of which these amendments affect, shall within 45 days of approval of this legislation shall amend their respective Plans of Operation to ensure conformity with these amendments.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

A. This legislation shall become effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

B. Amendments enacted herein at 2 N.N.C. §§ 1031(B) and 1034(E)(1) pertaining to the Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director shall take effect with the appointment of a new Navajo Nation Veterans Administration Executive Director after the six-year term of the current Executive Director's contract has expired or the current Executive Director is otherwise no longer contracted as Executive Director, whichever event transpires first.

SECTION SIX. CODIFICATION

The provisions of this legislation which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

SECTION SEVEN. SAVINGS CLAUSE

Should any provisions of this legislation be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions of this legislation which are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

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
