WINDOW ROCK, Ariz. — Members of the 24th Navajo Nation Council, led by Speaker Seth Damon, will be joined by Navajo Area Indian Health Service Director, Roselyn Tso, and Dr. Kevin Gaines, M.D., a commander in the U.S. Public Health Service, for a signing ceremony of Resolution No. NABIMA-08-22 in front of the Council Chambers on Thursday, March 31, 2022, at 8:00 a.m.

The resolution was passed by the Naabik'íyáti' Committee to express the gratitude of the Navajo Nation for the valor, commitment, and continued service of the Navajo Area Indian Health Service, Medical Service Providers, and Frontline Workers during the pandemic.

Last month, President Joe Biden nominated Roselyn Tso to serve as Director of the Indian Health Service (IHS) and currently leads the Navajo Area IHS. Once confirmed, Tso will provide leadership for a federal agency within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services that delivers health services to approximately 2.6 million American Indians and Alaska Natives.
